Corona made the global character of our economy very clear and thus a high, global interdependence. Without this global framework, the ecological crisis cannot be overcome. The regulation of cross-border relations to date has predominantly followed the model of free trade, in which price dominates as an instrument of control.

However, free trade and social and ecological regulations are often in conflict. The discussion of the German Supply Chain Act illustrates this. Cross-border regulation of Carbon prices is also important and dif-

ficult at the same time. Unequal CO2 costs in different countries penalise suppliers from countries with more ambitious climate policies. This is also a problem with the introduction of an EU Carbon border adjustment mechanism (CBAM).

In our context, the question of a „green“ monetary policy or the possibilities of fiscal policy and financial markets arises. At the 71st Monetary Workshop we want to discuss this without losing sight of the war against Ukraine, inflation, interest rate developments and markets.
